

Research Commercialisation Course – Consultancy, licensing & business creation**Monday 9 September - Friday 13 September 2019**

This five-day course of lectures, workshops and visits in Cambridge, UK, is aimed at those who wish to understand the basics of how new ideas and research results are commercialised at the University of Cambridge and in the wider Cambridge Cluster.

Information for applicants

- Submission of this form does not in itself mean acceptance; the information provided will be reviewed in order to assess the appropriateness of the course to the applicant, and places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis until the maximum number of delegates has been reached. Each applicant will receive a notification of acceptance within two working weeks of submitting the form.
- Where appropriate, a reserve list will be opened, and the relevant applicants notified.

Booking information and course fees

- Bookings without payment can only be held for 14 days.
- Course fees include 6 nights' accommodation (check in Sunday 8 September, check out Saturday 14 September), all materials, daytime refreshments and lunches plus a drinks reception on Monday 9 September and a closing dinner on Thursday 12 September.

Cancellation of your place

- Cambridge Enterprise regrets that no refund of the course fee can be made for cancellations received less than two weeks before the course starts. Substitutions can, however, be accepted subject to the eligibility criteria.
- If a cancellation is made between three and six weeks before the start of the course, a 40% refund will be given.
- Cancellations made longer than six weeks prior to the course will be refunded in full.

Application criteria

- At least 21 years of age and with some experience of working in a university, company or government organisation.
- In an appropriate work role. For example, a role that involves implementing or supporting the process of taking innovative products, processes or services towards market.
- Sufficient command of the English language to be able to read case study material and participate in group discussions in English.
- Able to participate in the entire programme from start to finish.
- Prepared to share their own experiences and issues with the other delegates and session leaders in frank and open discussions.
